Community-Based Adult Literacy

50 adults participated in JCLC's community programs

- Services delivered to residents of 11 Jefferson County Communities
- 39 English Language Learners (ELL) received instruction
- 9 tested learners advanced one or more NRS levels
- 2 individuals earned a high school credential
- 3 individuals earned U. S. Citizenship
- 18 volunteer tutors provided 1,765 hours of instruction
- 9 other volunteers provided 126 hours of service
- Piloted curriculum for English Language Learners
- Member of Community Partners: Connecting the Voices

Family Literacy

Supported families through community partnerships

- Children of incarcerated parents received free TumbleBooks and TeenBookCloud eBook subscriptions
- Presented to families of children enrolled in Head Start – services available, benefits of early literacy, and TumbleBooks, Feb. 2022
- Spanish and English children's books were purchased for Library in the Park
- Presented information to parents and children at the Lemonade Stand fundraiser, March 2022

Education for Justice-Involved Populations

50 incarcerated adults received services at the Jefferson County Jail

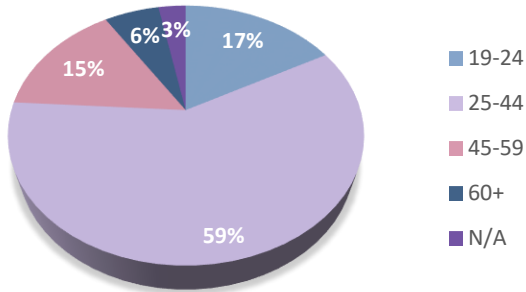
- 53.3% achieved a measurable skill gain during the period of participation
- 32 GED Ready and 38 GED tests were administered
- 6 individuals earned a GED/HSED
- 11 learners advanced one or more NRS levels
- 17 individuals earned OSHA-10 Safety certification
- Study Buddies were used for GED preparation
- Total of 2,306 hours of instructional hours delivered in person and virtually as necessary for the health and safety of everyone involved in the Correctional Education Program
- Chaired the Reducing Recidivism Coalition
- Served on the Community Justice Collaborating Council (CJCC)



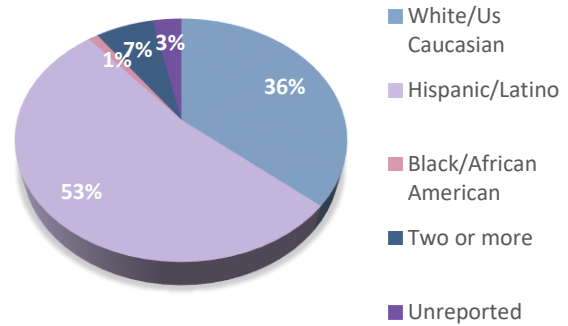

JCLC Learner Demographics

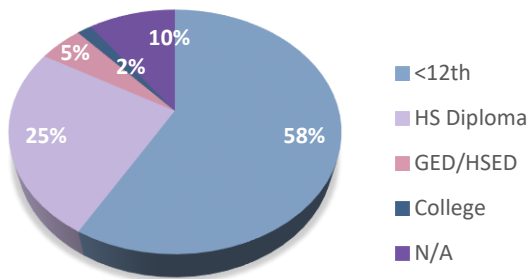
Age



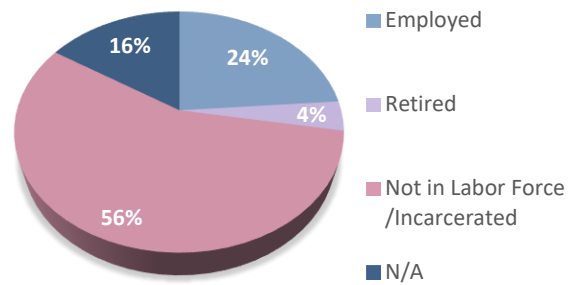
Ethnicity



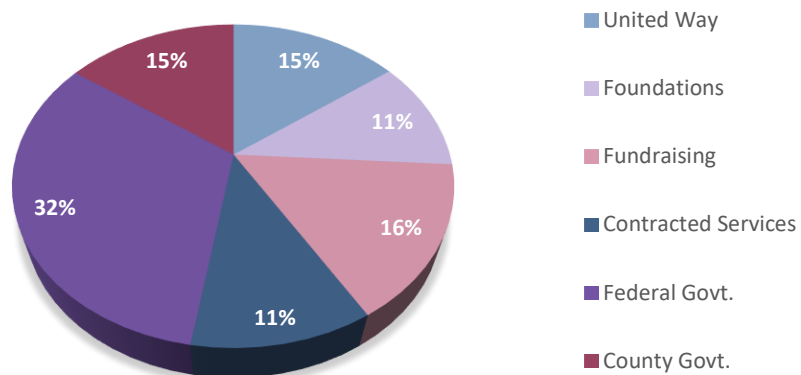
Level of Education
